Agent Orange

Veterans who served in a unit in or near the Korean Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) between April 1, 1968 and August 31, 1971, and who have a disease VA associates with Agent Orange exposure are presumed to have been exposed to herbicides. These Veterans do not have to show they were exposed to Agent Orange to get the treatment they need and have earned.
