

GIVING BACK BY VOLUNTEERING

U.S. Marine Corps Veteran William Heilman joined the Marines in 1967. After completing boot camp in South Carolina, he went to Florida for training as an avionics electrician and a test equipment calibration repairman. He was stationed in California for three years before he was sent to Okinawa, Japan.

While in Okinawa, William was injured in a serious accident and hospitalized for nine months. After being medically discharged in 1973, he worked for U.S. Customs in Armstrong County and

then for the U.S. Postal Service, which he retired from in 2009 after 31 years. He states, “I have been lucky. I have always worked for the government – while in the military and then as a civilian.”

Being in the hospital for an extended period, William remembers the volunteers that visited him and said he really appreciated them. “It’s really hard when you are in the hospital for such a long time. It is nice to have someone to talk to.”

William has been a volunteer for the Armstrong County Community-Based Outpatient Clinic (CBOC) since 2010. He and his wife volunteer their time to drive Veterans to medical appointments. “It feels really good to be able to give back to Veterans as a volunteer.” He lives on a 178 acre farm so that keeps him busy, but “volunteering is definitely not a waste of my time.” He is proud to say, “I have never turned down a Veteran that needs a ride. We get them

to their appointments even in the winter; we are extra careful during bad weather.” William is the only volunteer driver currently at the Armstrong CBOC. He occasionally drives for Butler and Clarion counties also.

William encourages other Veterans to volunteer at VA Butler. “The satisfaction of helping my fellow Veterans is reason enough, but I truly appreciate the camaraderie and the conversations with the Veterans while I am driving them to their



appointments. It is so nice to share stories with those that understand.”

BE THERE FOR VETERANS AND SERVICEMEMBERS

Not eligible for VA dental care? The Community Health Clinic of Butler County may be able to help! If you meet the eligibility requirements, and income guidelines, you may qualify for free dental care.

Eligibility requirements:

- Between the ages of 19-64
- A Butler County resident
- No private or government insurance
- Not eligible for dental care through VA
(Application Approval Required)
